

ACTIVE CONFLICTS IN THE MIDDLE EAST


Map of ongoing armed conflicts (Number of combat-related deaths in current or previous year):

Yemen


About 20.7 million people require food assistance

How Much Debris Covers the Gaza Strip


More than 42 million tonnes of debris across the Strip, according to the UN. That's enough rubble to fill a line of dump trucks stretching from New York to Singapore. Removing it all may take years and cost as much as \$700 million



Initial Clean-up

Removal of undetonated explosives by skilled search teams.

Retrieval of any recyclable material.

Removal of human remains, with Imam present.

Recovery of any intact personal items.

Clearing what's left

Removal of debris from demolition

Demolition of unsafe building structures

Final disposal

Non-recyclables taken to landfills

Rebuilding roads with recycled material

Recyclables crushed and tested

Hazardous waste taken to dedicated storage facilities

Center equity and social justice by embracing diverse lived experiences. Our global teams co-design adaptive initiatives elevating voices of marginalised groups towards holistic prosperity.


